Investments

Tarnobrzeg has thoroughly modernised the majority of its main roads. The water and sewage management system has undergone full-scale improvement thanks to over 12 000 000 euro from the EU Cohesion Fund. Moreover – the construction of the Tarnobrzeg Industrial and Technological Park, co-financed by the Operational Programme Development of Eastern Poland, has already started.



College

There are over 2500 students of the Państwowa Wyższa Szkoła Zawodowa im. prof. Stanisława Tarnowskiego (national vocational college) in Tarnobrzeg, and the city gained the vibrant life and an air of an academic city thanks to their activities.

Streets

City streets look different today. Last year alone over 30 kms of roads have been modernised, tens of kilometers of pavements put, as well as hundreds of new parking places made.



Schools

New schools, gyms, modernised and renovated buildings – education has been the priority of the Tarnobrzeg local government for years.

Sport

Robert Korzeniowski – Olympic champion in race walking, Alfred Freyer – athlete, Cezary Kucharski – football player – all of them started their careers in Tarnobrzeg. Today's youth of Tarnobrzeg follows their steps. Among them – women's table tennis players who have won the title of team champions of Poland 18 times during the last 19 years and have twice won the 2nd place during the Europe Cup championships.



Leisure

There are modern leisure spaces on the river Wisła banks – a skate park, a trial park, tennis courts – they are the beginning of a new leisure centre.

Also a modernised swimming pool containing a slide, a Jacuzzi, a sauna, and a modern fitness centre, is the local attraction.



Machowskie Lake

For nearly 40 years the Polish gold, sulphur, has been mined here. Soon there will be beaches, a marina, hotels – one of the biggest Polish artificial lakes is set to be made here.



TARNOBRZEG – a friendly city

Tarnobrzeg is situated in south-eastern Poland and sprawls on the right bank of the river Wisła. It used to be called the capital of the Polish sulphur, today it is one of the main cities in the region of Podkarpacie. It has a lot going like a Special Economical Zone – the youngest and fast developing or the Industrial and Technological Park under construction. The Machowskie Lake provides perfect conditions to actively seek refreshment on its side – its area is almost 500 hectares and the water 40 meters deep and extraordinarily clean. Still our greatest treasure is the people of Tarnobrzeg – friendly, outspoken and kind. Hence the city is a friendly one, too - to its people, investors and visitors. It is an attractive place to run a business and make investments.

Tradition...



The City Square

With an area of over 1,3 hectares it is the largest one in the region. It was re-made in the 90s. Today it is the traditional meeting place for the people of Tarnobrzeg, notably the young ones. It is tenderly called the Red Square (thanks to red tiles used to pave it).



Dominicans

Dominicans are present in Tarnobrzeg for the past 400 years. A baroque Dominican cloister hosts Matka Boska Dzikowska, a famous painting of the Dzikowska Holy Mary, who for centuries has been prayed to for protection by the city inhabitants and pilgrims alike.

Miechocin

This is the cradle of the city. 700 years ago Miechocin Academy has prepared students to study at the Jagiellonian University.



Dominican Fair

The tradition of the 16th century has been made alive at the end of the 20th century. The Fair takes place in the City Square on the Dominican cloister patron saint's day.

Tarnobrzeg Days

Tarnobrzeg Days are organized on the last weekend of May – to celebrate the anniversary of the city foundation. Even 20 thousand people gather in the Wisła meadows to witness the many attractions and participate in musical events.

Drama

„Barbórka Drama” means the best Polish theatres and magnificent actors. It is one of the rare occasions to see the most interesting of Polish theatre performances.



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

Tarnobrzeg stands out as a city with a very efficient infrastructure, low costs of using the production property and professional supplementary services. Qualified personnel, big postindustrial property, qualified personnel, big postindustrial property and the infrastructure well

developed. The city will receive 20 000 000 PLN for this purpose from the Operational Programme Development of Eastern Poland. Tarnobrzeg Industrial and Technological Park are included in the Tarnobrzeg Special Economical Zone.



Machowskie Lake

The Machowskie Lake, created where the sulphur mine used to be, offers perfect conditions to practise water sports – sailing, windsurfing and others. The lake has an area of almost 500 hectare and is 40 meters deep. This world-unique venture starts to bear fruits. Every year the lake hosts visitors and participants of the boat-race and windsurfing competition which accompany a shanty festival.


It has to be mentioned that the water is very clean and clear, the lake suitable for stocking with fish – soon it will surely become a heaven for divers and anglers. The Machowskie Lake is a great opportunity for Tarnobrzeg and its people. It is likely to become a place where not only the locals spend their free time in an attractive and interesting way. Hopefully it will become a regional leisure centre visited by tourists from all over Poland.



Tarnowski Castle in Dzików

The Tarnowski Palace in Dzików (today a part of Tarnobrzeg) is one of the most magnificent buildings in the region. It has been erected by the Tarnowski family in the 17th century. The Dzików Castle is currently undergoing a revaluation but a number of the Tarnobrzeg Museum exhibits can already be viewed there. The renovation of the castle is financed in a great part from the EU funds. From the end of August 2007 a part of collections has been opened in the renovated castle cellar. It is present

ing the archaeology of Tarnobrzeg, Miechocin pottery of 16th-18th century and the history of the Dzików Castle on 9 maquettes, showing the castle how it looked through the ages. There are also temporary exhibitions presented in castle cellars and once a month Thursday Castle Evenings are celebrated.



Modernising of the province road No. 871

Tarnobrzeg has been investing in modernising its transport system for years. During the last 5 years alone 50 kms of new roads, hundreds of new parking places and over 20 kms of cycle lanes have been built. At present Tarnobrzeg is starting the biggest road investment in its history. A province road No. 871 running through the city will be thoroughly modernised and an overpass over a rail route from Warsaw to Rzeszów erected. The construction will cost over 50 000 000 PLN. The investment is being carried out within the frames of the Operational Programme Development of Eastern Poland. The European Union will add 30 000 000 PLN to it.
